Assistant Professor of Geology (tenure-track) in Sedimentary Geology St. Norbert College, De Pere, Wisconsin

St. Norbert College invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track faculty position in geology starting August 2010. Teaching responsibilities include physical geology, historical geology, sedimentary geology (sed/strat), and an additional course, preferably in the area of structural geology or paleontology. Additional teaching opportunities include developing courses for the SNC General Studies Program. Appropriate field experience is required. The successful applicant is expected to participate in and eventually lead local, national, and international field trips, and supervise undergraduate research. In addition, SNC is in the planning process for a significant renovation of its science building, to include greatly expanded geology facilities and a teaching museum. Applications must include a curriculum vita, an essay addressing teaching and research interests, undergraduate and graduate transcripts (unofficial), and contact information for four references. Ph.D. in geology is required at the time of hire (August 2010).
